Neuroscience Programs in the Community: Not (Only) Brain Surgery

*There is perhaps no other medical or surgical specialty experiencing more growth than neurosciences. Expanded treatment capabilities, enhanced imaging, medical breakthroughs, and daily device and implant FDA approvals and introductions to the market all combine to drive amazing strides in patient treatment, outcomes, and decreasing patient disabilities. **What neuroscience offerings are provided at your organization? - What quality-tracking **mechanisms** would need to be implemented to report on new services?


A neuroscience expansion can cause trepidation, but **advanced capabilities can and should be available to the community**. This is no longer just the purview of large tertiary centers! *There is more to offer within neurosciences than brain surgery!* But in considering new treatment options, in order to develop a financially- and clinically-sound program that is regionally competitive, **a comprehensive strategic plan is imperative**.

In particular, when integrated into an organization's neuroscience service offerings, a formalized stroke program can do much to **improve access to care and garner new patient volume**. In fact, there are many similarities between advances in stroke care and the interventional treatment of emergent cardiac patients, which is now widely available at over 70% of hospitals of all sizes across the country. ***Communities expect that if organizations can handle heart attacks, they can handle strokes!***

In much the same way that STEMI (ST-Elevated Myocardial Infarction) care has evolved into highly process-driven, community-centered treatment, so too has stroke in recent years. Catheter-based treatments have emerged as the standard of care for large vessel occlusion strokes. The DAWN™ trial findings have increased the eligible population and given The Joint Commission's recent announcement regarding the introduction of a new level of certification for endovascular stroke treatment, there is no doubt that these treatment options are poised for rapid and widespread expansion into the community hospital setting.


Grand Opening of Musculoskeletal Center
